GENERAL CONDITIONS AND INFORMATION

The LAWS OF ASSOCIATION CROQUET Sixth Edition (amended 2008), WCF GOLF CROQUET RULES 2007 and SACA REGULATIONS FOR TOURNAMENTS June 2007 shall apply, including any amendments circulated by SACA prior to the tournament.

1. Entries on the official entry form accompanied by the entrance fees must reach the Secretary WPCA not later than **2 February 2010**. If feasible, printed draw sheets will be issued to each player on the first day of the tournament.
2. Dawson balls will be used for the tournament.
3. Unless otherwise advised, Association Croquet competitors are to report to Somerset West Croquet Club by 08:45 on Saturday, 6 March 2010 and Golf Croquet competitors to Kelvin Grove Croquet Club by 08:45 on Monday, 15 March 2010.
4. It is each player's responsibility to find out when and where they are due to play each day and to ascertain the details of each match. (i.e. whether it is time limited, handicap, level, double banked, etc). The Manager will supply this information on request but it is the responsibility of players to ensure that they have all necessary information and data relevant to their matches.
5. Competitors are advised to read 'SACA Regulations for Tournaments June 2007'. Special attention is drawn to the following:
 - (a) The tournament programme may be altered at the discretion of the Manager or in agreement with the Tournament Committee. (Regulation M2.c).
 - (b) Leave of absence will be granted only in exceptional circumstances, and only with the Manager's permission. If leave of absence has not been granted and players are absent or otherwise unable to play when called upon to do so by the Manager they are liable to forfeit the match. (M2.d). Competitors are requested to note on entry forms whether any leave of absence may be required.
 - (c) The Manager is authorised to impose a time limit on an entire event, or any round in an event and on any game. (Regulations M2.c / T1 and T5).
 - (d) The Manager is empowered to introduce the Two-Life variation on any event that is not a first-class event. (Regulation M2.c.7).
 - (e) Ties for winning/progressive positions in a block will be resolved according to the current Regulations F2.b and F2.c.
6. A telephone contact number is essential during the tournament. Home, business or mobile telephone numbers should be supplied in case a problem arises at the draw or subsequently.
7. Play will continue while there is sufficient light. This decision will be made by the Manager.
8. As soon as possible after the end of each match players are to report the scores and to check whether they are required for further play. Even if not scheduled to play further, players must still check with the Manager before leaving the venue.
9. Competitors may practice on the courts during the hours of play only after first obtaining permission from the Manager and under such conditions as imposed. (Reg. P4.e).
10. Unless a player has been given a special Golf Croquet handicap his/her handicap shall be determined from their Association Croquet handicap in accordance with the table.
